

Jane Goodall – my hero



In July 1960, at the age of 26, Jane Goodall traveled from England to what is now Tanzania and bravely entered the little-known world of wild chimpanzees. She was equipped with nothing more than a notebook and a pair of binoculars. But with her unyielding patience and characteristic optimism, she won the trust of these initially shy creatures, and she managed to open a window into their sometimes strange and often familiar-seeming lives. The public was fascinated and remains so to this day.




Thinking of volunteering?







Sharon continues "As with any area of science, our understanding of animal behaviour and welfare is constantly evolving. Chimpanzee Introductions

Thanks to the amazing efforts of the Great Apes Team we are now in a potential breeding situation for pure-bred Chimpanzees following the recently completed introduction process. This is now the largest group of Chimpanzees that we have ever had with 15 now in the group. This includes the new male, Kibali, who had a phased introduction through both Protected and Free Contact. Chimpanzees are very territorial and can be aggressive with physical displays and fighting. The Animal Keepers need to

have great skills to be able to read their



behaviour and need a deep understanding of this to predict who to introduce to whom and when. Previously our Chimpanzees were in small groups, however since the introductions started around 3.5-4 years ago the Team have done an amazing job during this time to now get the whole team together. We need to celebrate this amazing achievement and thanks are due to both the whole Great Apes Team and Dr Charlotte Macdonald who have made this all possible.




